Day 1 Mon 20 Nov: Home Port - Murray Bridge (D)

We **depart our pre-arranged pick up point** and begin the trek across to South Australia and the very scenic Kangaroo Island. We enjoy several comfort stops along the way for morning tea and lunch before arriving in Murray Bridge followed by check in and dinner.

Overnight: Murray Bridge, Adelaide Road Motor Inn

Day 2 Tuesday 21 Nov: Victor Harbor - Goolwa - Coorong NP (B, L,D)

This morning we travel down to the historic wharf and port of Goolwa. Here we board our **Coorong Discovery Cruise** and cruise by the Mouth of the Murray River and into the **Coorong National Park** stopping at Godfrey's Landing for a guided board walk across **Younghusband Peninsula** to view the Great Southern Ocean. We enjoy a delightful **lunch on board** as we travel down into the Coorong National Park. Our next stop is at Cattle Point for a guided walk into a significant Aboriginal site. Later in the day we return to **Goolwa** at the completion of our wonderful cruise before making our way to Victor Harbor for check in and dinner.

Day 3 Wed 22 Nov: Kangaroo Island (B,L,D)

This morning we drive across to Cape Jervis and board the Kangaroo Island Sea Link ferry for our crossing to **Kangaroo Island**. At Penneshaw we are met by **our very own experienced Kangaroo Island guide** and begin our adventure of the Island as we make our way around past the **American River Aquatic Reserve** and arrive at **Clifford's Honey Farm** for a little taste of local produce. We hear about the placid Ligurian Bees, their breeding and the production of over 10,000 kilograms of pure honey annually. Kangaroo Island is thought to be the only place in the world where a pure strain of the Ligurian bees exists. We enjoy a taste of the different varieties as well as the chance to purchase some of **Jenny's famous honey ice cream**. We also stop at the **Emu Ridge Eucalyptus Oil Distillery** where we will learn the distilling process, operating the same way it began in the 1890's. While here we may like to purchase a bottle from the only commercial distillery still in operation in South Australia. After a picnic lunch we make our way into **historic Kingscote** for a **highlights tour** before arriving at the **Island Pure Sheep Dairy** enjoying an audio visual before seeing the sheep being milked with up to 300 milked at any one milking and some may be surprised to learn that there are more sheep milked worldwide than cows. We also have the opportunity (if game) to taste their world class cheeses and yoghurt made at the dairy, which include Spanish, Greek, Italian and Cypriot recipes. Later in the afternoon we arrive at our secluded **Resort** and after check in enjoy dinner.

Day 4 Thurs 23 Nov: Flinders Chase National Park - Seal Bay (B,L,D)

This morning we travel into the magnificent **Flinders Chase National Park** enjoying breathtaking views of Yacca Flat on our way to the **Cape du Couedic Lighthouse** and keepers residences. Built in 1909 it is considered to be the Islands finest structure. With the automation of the lighthouse, the nearby keeper's residences are now available for accommodation. This area is home to a colony of **New Zealand Fur Seals** and the natural land bridge that is "**Admirals Arch**". After taking the boardwalk down to the arch we may witness the amazing sight of New Zealand Fur Seals frolicking in the water and on the rocks under the arch. We then travel a short distance to Weirs Cove as our guide explains the history of the ruins of the storage huts and the steep jetty. We then view the spectacular **Remarkable Rocks**. We are able to take a walk around these unusual huge boulders, which have been carved, into many different weird and wonderful shapes by the wind and ocean spray over many centuries. Later in the morning we travel back to the resort for an early lunch then make our way into the famous **Seal Bay Conservation Park**, the only place in the world where we can stroll with our guide through a wild seal colony. Seal Bay is home to around 600 of the rare Australian Sea Lions. After leaving Seal Bay we make our way to the **Hanson Bay Wildlife Sanctuary** for a cuppa from the coach while spotting the Koalas, Cape Barron Geese, Kangaroos, and Wallabies sharing the idyllic surrounds. We then travel back to our retreat for dinner.

Day 5 Fri 24 Nov: Kangaroo Island - Hahndorf - Barossa (B,D)

This morning we travel back down to **Penneshaw** before visiting the **Gateway Information Centre**, which is home to the original **Frenchman's Rock**, and an interpretive display of the Island and also a great place to purchase souvenirs and local produce. We **board the Kangaroo Island Sea Link Ferry** for our return journey to **Cape Jervis** before making our way up into the beautiful Barossa Valley wine region via the **German Village of Hahndorf** for the chance to purchase lunch. This afternoon we continue through to the Barossa stopping at the magnificent **Chateau Barossa** which showcases the magnificent **Antique Museum**. The museum contains a private collection of antique furniture and Meissen porcelain, considered one of the most valuable and important in the world. We can also browse the Wine and Rose Gift Shop, and then finally taste the exclusive wines in the Cellar Door. We make our way to our motel to check-in and a chance to relax. Dinner tonight is at the motel restaurant.

Day 6 Sat 25 Nov: Barossa - Murray Bridge (B,L,D)

This morning we begin our journey homeward as we depart for Tanunda where we visit the **Barossa Regional Gallery** located in the heart of the beautiful Barossa Valley. Combining heritage and contemporary architecture. We enjoy an informative tour before making our way to the historic **Seppeltsfield Wines** where we enjoy the “Heritage Tour” and tastings, which includes a behind the scenes look through the estate’s treasure trove of historical buildings and spectacular surroundings. Learn of the Seppelt family history and their profound influence on the Australian wine industry. We explore the homestead veranda, elm walk, distillery and underground blending cellar. Next we visit heritage listed **Collingrove Homestead and Garden** where we enjoy a tour followed by lunch. Conceived as a little piece of England and commenced in 1856, Collingrove was the Angas family home and headquarters for their considerable pastoral interests. This family made significant contributions to the growth and development of South Australia from its earliest days through political involvement, pastoral endeavor and philanthropic gesture. Next we make our way to the **Mannum Dock Museum**, located on the banks of the River Murray in the historic river port town of Mannum, South Australia. The Mannum Dock Museum of River History is a heritage attraction focusing on river history showing the preservation of life on the River Murray and surrounding areas. Displays in the Museum follow the life of the Murray River from its birth, showcasing fossilised sea creatures that once inhabited the Murray River area when it was an inland seabed; the occupation of the Aboriginal people, depicting food gathering, boat building, trading and Ngarrindjeri dreaming; the coming of white settlement and the birth of Mannum as a settlement, the start of the river trade, its growth and the important part it has played in our history. We then make our way to Murray Bridge for check-in and a rest before dinner.

Day 7 Sun 26 Nov: Murray Bridge - Home Port (B)

This morning we continue our trek back home as we travel down through Taillem Bend and Bordertown before continuing along the Western Highway. We enjoy several comfort stops for morning tea, lunch and afternoon tea before arriving back home late afternoon after a wonderful few days of discovery on Kangaroo Island with Daytripper Tours.
